BRUSHBOX IS A POPULAR CHOICE FOR FLOORING AS IT FEATURES A FINE, EVEN TEXTURE AND IT'S GRAIN IS NATURALLY UNBLEMISHED.

Ranging in colour from rich reddish browns to palish pinks with interesting grain and colouration patterns, this timber offers both character and resilience whilst providing an impressive addition to any project.

Brushbox is a popular choice for flooring, cladding, panelling and joinery applications. It has an average Janka hardness rating of 9.5 and a dry density of 900 kg/m³.

As with many wood products, natural variations in terms of colour and grain exist but this only adds to its individuality, charm and appeal.

COMMON NAME	Brushbox
LOOK & FEATURES	Brushbox has a grain that usually interlocks to varying degrees. It is a species that is low in tanins.
BOTANICAL NAME	Lophostemon confertus
COLOUR	Heartwood varies in colour from a pinkish grey to a rich reddish brown. Sapwood usually distinctively paler.
COMMON USES	An extremely versatile timber with uses ranging from flooring, cladding, panelling and joinery applications.
